Asteroid Hits 3rd Grade Classroom!



Third and fifth grade students welcomed Mr. Justin Mason, the planetarium director from Old Dominion University for a unique astronomy lesson. The highlight of the visit was the opportunity our students had to touch a

meteorite that that had fallen to the Earth. The students learned that the meteorite was bought for \$8,000 and that it weighed 63 pounds. The students also received "rainbow glasses" that separates lights into prisms. Students had fun learning new things and seeing all that Mr. Mason had to share with them!

States of Matter, Matter!



Students in 2nd grade have been busy learning about the states of matter, a unit of study in the Nancy Larson Science program.

Sister Marie de Lourdes planned an engaging activity for the students to observe how water can change from liquid to solid. The students visited the science lab where they observed an ice cube melting rapidly on a hot plate. Mrs. Sofianek explained to them how molecules move at different rates to create the states of matter.

In class, the students also observed another physical characteristic of matter when they noticed that light can pass through certain solid objects. They learned the vocabulary terms of transparent, opaque, and translucent and identified objects in the classroom that had these characteristics. We love our hand's on science program!

Greetings in Christ!

October is here already! In the Catholic tradition, this month is dedicated to Mary, under the title of Our Lady of the Rosary and to respecting human life in all stages from conception to natural death. We have begun our custom of praying a decade of the Rosary after morning prayers together, outside by the Mary statue near the gym. This Friday, we will have Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament in our school chapel.

During September, students in grades 2-8 took the *Performance Series* Assessments in the areas of math and reading. The student Score Report is being sent home in the folder today. The fall assessments provide baseline skill development data. The students will also be assessed in the winter and spring.

As an instructional tool, teachers use this information to help them guide instruction in the classroom and track progress and growth in basic skills. Specifically, teachers will be monitoring the scaled score for growth throughout the year and looking at skill attainment to identify areas of instructional strength and opportunity. Moving forward, the winter assessments will act as a measure for student academic growth based on instructional practices, and the spring assessments will provide a snapshot of student performance over the course of the school year.

Like adults, students have good and bad days and their assessment performance can vary based on a variety of factors that day. It is important to remember that we are developing the whole child, and this is one source of data used throughout the school year to measure student learning and progress.

Please look closely at the glossary at the bottom of your child's report for information on each component. We realize you may have additional questions, and we encourage you to discuss this report with your child's classroom teacher.

Special thanks to Mr. Scott Glenn for organizing and planning the SMSS Golf Tournament which will take place this Saturday, October 6th. We look forward to seeing some of you on the golf course and ask for your prayers for good weather.
