Some of these speakers also have close ties to our own students, such as Mrs. Renata Platt, great grandmother of Haleigh Binder, who came to tell us her story of living in World War II Germany; Officer Hughes, father of Patrick Hughes, from the Virginia State Police, who spoke with our students about the dangers of substance abuse and Dr. Martin Cruz and Mrs. Sara Pickett who

gave a lesson on health to our students. These experiences are ones that our students will remember for years to come!



# Happenings in Lower School

#### **An Owl Dissection Activity**

Although our 2<sup>nd</sup> grade students were very excited to participate in an owl pellet dissection activity, they still couldn't hide their funny faces as they opened those pellets! The dissection activity was part of the Nancy Larson Science unit on birds where they studied all about birds - including the different kinds, how they build nests, what their young are called, including a focus on owls. The Nancy Larson Science program provides hands-on laboratory experiences to introduce the students to different parts of science at a very early age, including dissection!





# STEM Days Ignite Interest in Science, Technology, Engineering and Math

Ms. Gilliam coordinated several STEM Days this year to engage our 2<sup>nd</sup> – 4<sup>th</sup> grade students in activities involving science, technology, engineering and math. To further connect these days to our students' daily lives, the themes centered around Christmas, Easter, and Valentine's Day. Students rotated between stations to design, build and construct various projects. The activities also taught them to work creatively together and to communicate with each other in order to develop plans for solving a challenge. At Saint Mary's, we think it is never too early to spark our students' interest in science, technology, engineering and mathor to help them think about pursuing a STEM career in college!

#### **MUSICAL STUDENTS AT SAINT MARY'S!**

Our students underwent a musical experience with Mr. Jamie Auberg, from Auberg Instructional Innovations. Mr. Auberg brought two unique musical activities to Saint Mary's. The Instrument Petting Zoo lesson gave our students the opportunity to try musical instruments from the four different instrument families: percussion, woodwinds, strings, and brass. In the Paper Magic lesson, the students combined art, science, physics, and technology to create working musical instruments out of paper. They applied their full creativity to construct paper drums, paper flutes and paper maracas!





#### STUDENTS PLANT FLOWERS TO REPRESENT THE GROWTH OF VIRTUES WITHIN THEMSELVES

During the school year, Virtue Club students discuss how virtues help each of them blossom and grow to become a disciple of Jesus Christ. To exemplify the beautiful results of living the virtues, this spring, the students planted flowers in the beds around the cafeteria. Earlier in the year, they also planted *Forget Me Not flowers* in the raised flower beds located near the statue of Mary by the primary building. The students have been taking care of these flowers and are now seeing the beautiful star blue flowers blossom. They are looking forward to continuing to live the virtues they have learned and seeing the fruit of their hard work in the coming months.





### A Unique Hands-on Lesson on Fish Adaptations

Our 2<sup>nd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> grade students participated in a close and personal experience with different kinds of fish through a presentation by guest speakers from the Virginia Institute of Marine Science. The students learned about animal adaptations and the various ways that fish can protect themselves in their natural habitats. After viewing a presentation about the adaptations, the students touched and observed a variety of preserved fish. Finally, the students were instructed to state the specific adaptations their fish uses to find food or avoid being eaten. This was another fun Marine Science activity which aligned with the science curriculum.

### Crowning Blessed Mary with one of God's most Beautiful Creations

Saint Mary's continues its tradition of crowning our Blessed Mother Mary at our Annual May Procession ceremony. On this special day, our 2<sup>nd</sup> grade students who have celebrated the sacrament of First Eucharist are honor guards for our 8<sup>th</sup> grade students during the procession. This is a special ceremony when our school family gathers near a statue of Mary to honor her as our heavenly Mother. Before the statue of Mary is crowned with a beautiful wreath of flowers by two of our eighth grade students, the children present flowers to Mary. The ceremony ends with singing and praising God for the gift of Mary and for the love she has for all of us.



# Happenings in Upper School

#### MIDDLE SCHOOL STUDENTS SUPPORT HAITIAN MINISTRY

Middle school students supported the Haitian Ministry at Saint Kateri Tekakwitha Catholic Church by raising funds to help four students in Haiti attend school for a full year. To raise funds, students pledged to live in ways similar to the ways people live in Haiti. For a full week, students gave up technology, did the dishes by hand, helped prepare dinner, and cleaned the house and other such tasks. Father Michenet DuPortal, from Saint Michel's parish in Boucan-Carré in Haiti, visited Saint Mary's to thank the students for their support.



# There's No Place like Saint Mary's to perform the Wizard of Oz!

Our 8<sup>th</sup> grade students had the most enjoyable experience as they performed the Wizard of Oz at the American Theatre under the direction of Saint Mary's Alum, Angela Stellute Ballard. Student actors gained valuable public speaking skills, but also many life skills; among them were cooperation, problem solving, communication, and empathy. As they developed their characters, they also learned to express themselves through voice, facial expressions and body language. The talent, time and creativity of the students working behind the scenes with props, costumes and scenery were also key components to the success of the play.





## In Life Science, Students Experience Hands-on Dissections!

The 6<sup>th</sup> grade science curriculum focuses on life science. This year began with a study of the various animal phyla progressing from the simplest organisms to the most complex. Dissecting earthworms started this process of investigation and research. Next, the students dissected and studied clams, oysters, crayfish, frogs, and perch. They studied marine animals ranging from single-celled organisms and plankton to the more complex organisms such as frogs and perch. Needless to say, these students have experienced an eye-opening experience!





### FORENSICS CLUB STUDENTS EXCEL AT COMPETITIONS

Public speaking is a skill that can help students with their current studies, civic participation, job searches, career development, and even personal relationships. Under the direction of parent volunteers Mrs. Karen Cruz and Ms. Andrea Mayo-Santos, a group of students in the Saint Mary's Forensics team combined public speaking and forensics to garner awards at both the Forensics League of Tidewater Catholic Middle Schools Competition and at the Walsingham Academy Middle School Invitational Forensics Tournament. ## Students Build Buoys to Simulate Real Navigation Safety Devices

As a culminating lesson in physical science for 7<sup>th</sup> grade and oceanography for 8th grade, students had the opportunity of building water buoys with VIMS staff members. With the inclusion of Marine Science, this STEM (science, technology, engineering and math) project was a perfect challenge for inquisitive minds of these eager students. The construction of buoys using PVC pipes proved the importance and the effect of surface area on buoyancy; this will help them to construct a permanent buoy to carry equipment and probes to test the water quality of Mill Creek in the future. The data will be compared with research data from VIMS at various locations. The learning goal for the students was to compare and contrast data to determine the causes of various observations. Way to go, future scientists, mathematicians, engineers and technology experts!

#### What's Great About Virginia's Tax Credit Program?

A tax credit allows you to subtract the amount of the credit – dollar for dollar- from the total you owe the state in taxes, not from taxable income. It is not necessary to itemize in order to use tax credits. Use it like a coupon when you prepare your taxes. Tax Credits directly reduce tax bills.

#### What's different about this program?

Donations for tax credits cannot be directly donated to the school, but instead must go to an approved scholarship foundation, such as the Diocese of Richmond's McMahon Parater Foundation for Education.
