Catholic Schools Week focuses on the important spiritual, academic, and societal contributions provided by a Catholic education. This year's theme was, "Catholic Schools: Learn. Serve. Lead. Succeed." As Bishop George V. Murry, SJ, of Youngstown, Ohio, chairman of the U. S. Conference of Catholic Bishops Committee on Catholic Education said, "Catholic schools provide an invaluable service to young people, their families, and our nation by helping to form women and men with the sharp intellects, broad perspectives and big hearts who bring their best to communities near and far."

At Saint Mary Star of the Sea School, the students are challenged every day to "learn, serve, lead, and succeed." This year our students demonstrated their leadership and commitment to serve their communities in various ways. Our 5th grade students organized a lemonade sale in which they raised \$725 to support the Annual Rice Bowl project during Lent. SOCIAL STUDIES FAIR DRAWS FAMOUS HISTORIC CHARACTERS



The annual Social Studies Fair brought some famous historical characters to Saint Mary's. Students in 5th grade chose from topics about the American Revolution, while 6th grade students chose topics starting with the Civil War up to the early 1900's. The students researched their topic, wrote an essay, created a large display board, a display model, and dressed up in a costume for their oral presentation to a panel of judges. The award for the most creative project went to Hollie Morris (6th grade) who brought a pony to school to feature the Pony Express, a mail service delivering messages, newspapers, and mail, beginning in 1859. Other projects included the Wright Brothers, the Battle of Gettysburg, Florence Kelley, the Clash of Ironclads, King George III, and the Battles of Lexington and Concord, just to name a few!

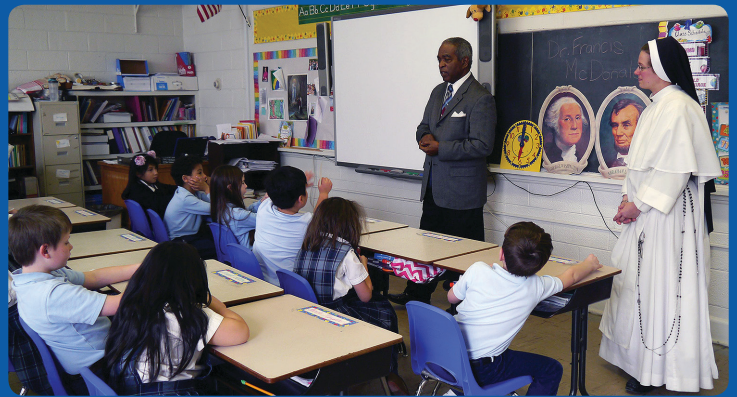


FIRST VOCABULARY PARADE DRAWS SOME CREATIVE COSTUMES!

IT IS ALL ABOUT SCIENCE WITH MRS. SOFIANEK

Mrs. Victoria Sofianek, Saint Mary Star of the Sea Science teacher kept our 8th grade students busy while they worked on a variety of hands-on projects to support their units of study. The students researched earthquake-resistant structure design and then built and tested structures able to resist a simulated earthquake with a seismographic app that measures the "magnitude" of the earthquake. This activity supported a unit of study on plate tectonics. At Saint Mary's we provide students with lessons to apply science to engineering.

IT WAS AN EVENING OF POETRY, POISE & PRAYER

The 8th grade students and their parents met at Saint Mary Star of the Sea Church for a celebration of the Mass followed by dinner and poetry recitation. This cross-curricular event is facilitated by our teachers to enrich the learning experiences of the students. This year, Sister Anne Elise focused on proper table setting, table etiquette, and appropriate conversation. With Mrs. Heather Potchatek, the students were immersed in poetry reading and memorization. Each student chose a poem which they recited for the parents. At Saint Mary's, we feed the mind and the spirit of our students!



BUTTER MAKING GETS STUDENTS TO COMPARE COSTS IN MATH CLASS

Students in the 6th grade Math class shook cream to the tunes of some fun music to make 'school-made' butter. Mr. Williams planned this lesson so that students could compare the cost of the school-made butter vs. store-bought butter... and do it in a fun way! First, students looked up the cost of butter and determined the cost per ounce. Then, they looked at the cost of the heavy cream needed to make butter. The butter was then weighed and they obtained the cost for an ounce of school-made butter. It turned out that the store-bought butter was more cost effective... but did it taste better?





CIVICS TO BECOME PART OF MIDDLE SCHOOL CURRICULUM

This August, Saint Mary's 8th grade students will take Civics as part of the middle school curriculum. The course will prepare our students to become knowledgeable and proactive members of a democratic society by teaching them how to be a responsible citizen and to understand

how their government works. This spring, all of Saint Mary's students took part in a Civics lesson as they participated in a Flag Retirement Ceremony led by the Cub Scouts, Boy Scouts and the SMSS Girl Scouts. Students learned the steps to dispose a damaged flag honorably; first cutting the stripes and then burning the individual pieces. Saint Mary's Students Live the Gospel through Community Service

We live the Christian Gospel, the Good News! Jesus Christ gave us the two great commandments of loving God and loving our neighbors. He also told us that at the end of our lives we will be judged on how well we lived out those commandments of love. Saint Mary's students had the opportunity to tangibly live these commandments during this year by doing service and by centering their service hours on the works of mercy. Students in 8th grade were required to complete six hours per semester, 7th grade, five hours per semester and 6th grade, four hours per semester. With the support of the school and their families, we are proud to report that our 34 middle school students completed more than 500 service hours this year. The community service projects in which the students were involved included servicing the church, the community, or working directly with the poor.

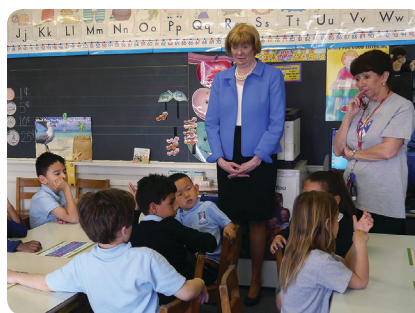

MARINE SCIENCE CLUB STUDENTS COLLECT DATA TO HELP CITY OF HAMPTON

Marine Science Club students met with Christine Ausink from the Hampton Clean City Commission who talked to them about the City of Hampton Assessment to Reduce Trash (CHART) program.

The program analyzes trash collected under the supervision of engineers working for the City of Hampton. With the help of parent volunteers, and under the direction of Ms. Ausink, the students learned how to safely collect data (trash on the shoreline). The data collected is used by the City of Hampton to develop programs to protect the shoreline in Hampton Roads and reduce trash. In the fall, the club will examine the results, meet with Ms. Ausink, and discover how the data was used by the City of Hampton!

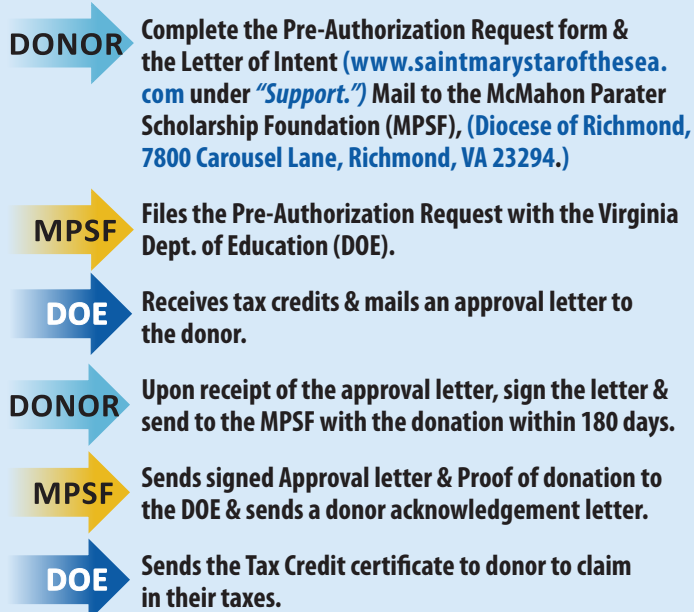
Science Curriculum Writer Nancy Larson Visits Saint Mary's

The students were really excited to meet Nancy Larson in person since they knew she created the hands-on science lessons and the interactive science booklets. Saint Mary's has been using the Nancy Larson Science program since 2014 for kindergarten through 4th grade. In 2016, the program was also adopted for 5th grade. The Nancy Larson Science is in line with the school's mission to provide children with a challenging STEM curriculum.

DONATE THROUGH THE TAX CREDIT PROGRAM AND DEDUCT 65%!

This past academic year (2017-18), 78 students, or 49% of the student population at Saint Mary's, received over \$211,000 in scholarships from the Education Improvement Scholarship Tax Credit Program, Parish sharing, and Saint Mary's funds. The financial assistance that our families received reduced the tuition costs so that families were able to continue to send their children to our school where they are provided with a challenging, faith-based program in a safe and nurturing environment. We are extremely thankful for your support of the EISTC Tax Credit Program which with your support now stands at: \$154,404 for the 2018-19 school year. Donors have until December to participate in this year's program. Start planning your giving through the EISTC Tax Credit Program and claim your 65% tax credit in your April 2019 taxes.
