With continued renovation over the past five years, including window replacements, new lighting, updated bathrooms and a new heating system, the 1955 building will continue to be a special setting for the education of our younger students, building memories of school for a lifetime to come.

YOUR EISTC TAX CREDIT DONATIONS SUPPORT 30% OF SMSS STUDENTS

Have you ever considered donating to Saint Mary Star of the Sea School? Direct financial support given through the Education Improvement Scholarships Tax Credits (EISTC) program provides school choice opportunities to both families of low-income students and students with disabilities. Currently over 4,000 students in the Commonwealth of Virginia are served by this successful and necessary school program.

With your donation you are eligible to receive a Virginia Tax Credit equal to 65% of your contribution. In addition to your 65% state tax credit, deductions against taxable income as a charitable donation on both federal and state income taxes can be taken as well.

Over 30% percent of students currently attending Saint Mary Star of the Sea School receive benefits through this program. It is likely someone you know in our school community depends on EISTC to provide a loving, quality education for their child or children.

RECENT NEWS ABOUT EISTC PROGRAM:

Recently legislation was introduced (House Bill 521) to dismantle this scholarship program in its entirety. On January 29, 2020 this bill went before the House Finance Committee. During this session they voted to continue until 2021. What does this mean? Over the next year proponents will be lobbying to get this bill passed in the Virginia legislature. Because of this it is so important that you let your voice be heard. The Virginia Catholic Conference is a great resource to help you take action and express your personal views on how important the EISTC program is to the viability and future of Saint Mary Star of the Sea School, and all schools and families in the state of Virginia who are served by this invaluable program. The website helps you compose your message and sends it on your behalf.

While some collected the discarded items, others tallied the types of litter found. The data will be sent to Longwood University and the International Coastal Cleanup project.

STEM Scholarship Awarded to Nathan Pincus, Class of 2015

We congratulate Nathan Pincus, from the Class of 2015, who was the recipient of the STEM Scholarship. Nathan plans to serve the United States Air Force after he graduates from James Madison University with



a degree in Computer Science. The STEM Scholarship was established by the Class of 2013. Since then, each graduating class has contributed annually to award this \$500 scholarship to a Saint Mary's graduate pursuing a degree in a STEM-related field. Nathan's father, Joe, is a 1980 SMSS graduate.



SAINT MARY'S RECEIVES DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION PURPLE STAR DESIGNATION



Saint Mary Star of the Sea School, along with three other Catholic schools on the Peninsula - Peninsula Catholic High School, Our Lady of Mount Carmel, and St. Pius X - were awarded the Virginia Purple Star designation by the Virginia Department of Education.

This designation is selectively awarded to schools that have demonstrated a major commitment to students and families connected to our nation's military.

"It is with great joy that we receive this special recognition as a Purple Star school," said Principal, Sister Mary John Slonkosky. "This award acknowledges the 96-year tradition of our school serving the vast numbers of families from the many military bases on the Peninsula. We have been honored to be a part of their lives through our ministry of Catholic education."

Kelly Lazzara, superintendent of schools for the Catholic Diocese of Richmond said, "It is an honor for our schools to be awarded the Purple Star designation. As an active duty military spouse, I know firsthand the value and importance of schools being committed to and supportive of our students and families who are in the military. Every day I see our schools going above and beyond and I am proud to have our schools serve those who serve our country."

The Purple Star emblem was selected because the color purple symbolizes all branches of the military. The Hampton Roads area is home to one of the nation's largest populations of military personnel, and to the largest naval base in the world located in Norfolk.

SCIENCE TEACHER SUBMITS PROJECTS TO ONLINE SCIENCE FAIR

While Mrs. Sofianek recorded the students' presentations, some of her tech-savvy students ensured the projects were uploaded successfully to the YouTube channel. Saint Mary's was the first school to upload the projects online. What a great example of a teacher's commitment to her students and the school.

TEACHERS TRANSITION TO REMOTE LEARNING TO CONTINUE TEACHING IN DIFFICULT TIMES

As we received the news of the schools' closures due to the threat of the Coronavirus, our teachers quickly learned that there are creative and effective



ways to teach and learn remotely. While our younger students are receiving weekly packets to work at home, our older students are using Google Classroom to work on their assignments. The teachers are using other digital tools to communicate with their students, such as Zoom, Facetime, and video-conferencing to explain and clarify concepts. The buildings at Saint Mary's may be closed for the rest of the school year, but with the work of our teachers, the learning continues!
